

THE FOUR LOBES

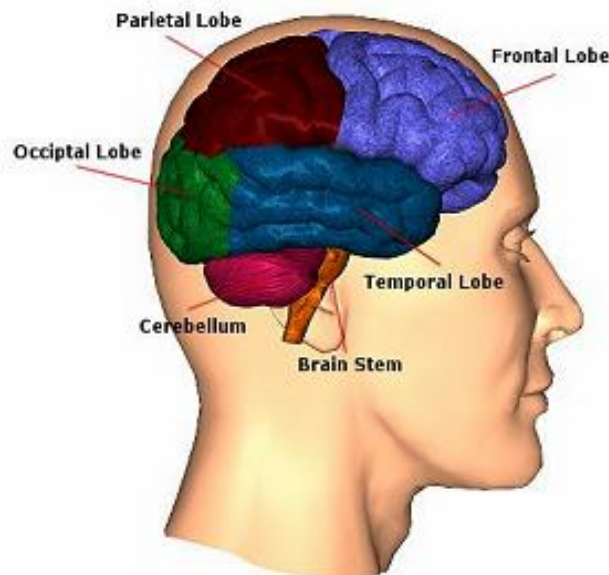
Each does different things but they all work together.

Parietal Lobe

Monitors sensation and body position
Controls reading
Recognises faces
Understands time
Judges what objects are

Frontal Lobe

Makes Plans
Learns from mistakes
Works out how to do things
Adapts to new situations
Controls emotions and impulses
Controls activity levels
Controls expressive language
Controls voluntary movement
Helps us 'get along' with other people



Occipital Lobe

Receives visual information
Interprets colour, shape, distance

Temporal Lobe

Looks after memory and new learning
Control how things are ordered
Receives auditory messages
Understands spoken language, rhythm, intonation
